With the flame of St. Bridget, we proclaim the transformative power of God. We give thanks that God's transforming love has been, is now, and will ever be at work within us and in all creation. Amen.

Today, we celebrate the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Feast of All Saints, and the Feast of All Souls. In this season of change and letting go, we remember those who have gone before, all those of whom we have let go, but whose presence we still seek. We call to mind the witness of their lives and how we are in the world because of them. The readings today remind us that God's love is extended to us in many ways and through many people. And so we begin our prayer in the name of the Divine: Source of All That Is, Eternal Word, and Holy Wisdom Sophia. Amen.

<u>Transformation Rite</u>* adapted from *Prayers of Honoring Voice* by Pixie Lighthorse We gather in community, acknowledging our struggles and sorrows on this side of the veil. We do this without pretense, that we may more fully embrace the gift of our humanity.

1. When it seems like everyone around us has it together, help us see that we are not alone. Give us compassion for others who nervously retreat, and help us offer them understanding.

ALL: We bless this, our human life.

2. When we are in the presence of another's upset, encourage us to trust that we can speak the simplest words about what is happening and be effective.

ALL: We bless this, our human life.

3. When our hope wanes, quiet the doubts that hinder us. Keep us embodied and grounded to earth. Put healers on our path to help us release our resistance to what is.

ALL: We bless this, our human life.

4. Let us hold precious the memory of those who have crossed over by letting them be part of us. Ferry our heart's grief across the seas to connect with all those who are aching with loss. Hear our sorrowful voices mingling in one powerful song of love.

ALL: We bless this, our human life.

Opening Prayer

We acknowledge all the souls who have come before us. We look to the saints to show us how to hand over to the generations that follow, Your original blessings—a world of justice, peace, and beauty.

LITURGY OF THE WORD**

We experience the Spirit of Our Living God as we listen to the Scripture readings broken open and shared by all.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:4-9

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy:

Hear O Israel: The Name that is Holy, our God, is One. Love your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. Write these words...in your heart. Recite them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand. Fix them as an emblem on your forehead. Write them on the doorposts of your home and on your entryways.

The inspired words of our ancient spiritual tradition. Amen.

Responsorial: Wisdom 3:1-9, 13-14

Cantor: God's grace and compassion are on the holy ones.

The souls of the just are in the hand of God.

No torment will ever touch them.

In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died.

Their departure was thought to be a disaster,

their leaving us to be their end.

But they are at peace. **R**

In the time of their visitation, they will shine forth:

they will run like sparks through the stubble;

they will inherit the land.

Blessed are those who hearts are clean:

they will see God.

Blessed too are those who work for peace:
they will be called children of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted
because of their struggle for justice:
the kindom of heaven is theirs.

Shared Homily: Donna Mazzola

Remember that staticky sound when you turned the knob on the radio to find your favorite station? Then, that moment when your music came in perfectly? Much thanks to our FM tuners. FM—frequency modulation—operates in a very high frequency and is less susceptible to interference...less audible static.

What can we do in the midst of the interference of sounds that feed into our fears and anxieties? Sounds which take us away from a centered and grounded way of living in unwavering faith and hope? Our readings today honor the Communion of Saints and offer us ways to attune to the Great Love that Loves us.

The first reading, the start of the Shema, is prominent in all Jewish liturgy. Our Jewish friends recite it with hands over the eyes in the morning and at day's end. *Hear O Israel...our God, is One.* Love your God with full heart, full soul, and all your strength. (Because...this is how we are loved.) Write these words on your doorposts, bind it to your hand...breathe it, talk it, walk it. Clear guidance for attuning to the Love that Loves us.

We hear Jesus say in the Beatitudes, that to be blessed and happy is not about conforming to laws, but in having a simple, and open heart that awakens us to the presence of God. He advocates a way that stands in opposition to the standards of our world—values which often sound like static and interference. Each beatitude is a wild wisdom that invites us to turn our way of life upside down.

The Beatitudes give us a description of the Communion of Saints—those who are on our side, rooting for us: the poor in spirit, the ones who know how to grieve, the gentle, those who struggle for justice and liberation, the forgiving and merciful, those who fall, fail, yet get up again. Today we remember and celebrate holiness like theirs.

We embrace this communion of holy ones, our Spirit Team. They inspire us to a higher frequency of living. We humans thrive with the support of community, teachers, and ancestors, both seen and unseen. By regularly invoking and thanking them, we nourish these relationships and invite their hands of support on our backs.

May these beloveds be our insurance, keep us in touch, come in our dreams, empower who we are, how we walk and speak. May the ancestors help us in ways they couldn't when they were here—help us lay down our burdens, be with us in our struggles. May the saints walk with us toward joy. May our beloved ones, teach us ways to connect with them, arms reaching back for reassurance and giving us reasons to grow our mustard seeds of faith, beyond our forgetting.

I invite you to share how the readings and reflections have spoken to you.

Holding these thoughts in the sacred space among us and strengthened by the support of one another, we now proclaim our affirmation of faith:

Affirmation of Faith***

5. We have faith in one God, one Source of all life, one Ground of the whole Earth, who created all things good.

6. And we have faith

in Christ, in whom we have been shown the special role of humanity to bear God's likeness in working and caring for Creation, in seeking to understand her mysteries and powers, in working with these powers for the wellbeing of life on Earth.

7. And we have faith

in God's Spirit who leads us to a meek, unselfish and compassionate life-style. So that the Earth is inherited in peace,

her life is transformed for all creatures and her bounty shared justly. So be it. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful

Knowing our God is faithful, generous, and abiding, let us bring to this Table our cares and concerns—for ourselves, our loved ones, and our world. Our response is: We awaken to your call.

For whom and for what shall we pray?

Eternal Source of Life, help us discover how we can be most useful, for we long to see a world where there is joy, where it is safe to live, and where everyone

belongs. Show us the way to nourish one another. Empower us to co-create this world as you intend it to be. Amen.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Sign of Peace

As we prepare this sacred meal, we reaffirm that just as Jesus was anointed, so is each of us. And so, we celebrate our Creator's fruitful love as we extend our blessing to one another with joy. May the peace that our brother Jesus offers be always with us!

Offertory (All raise bread and cup)

We place on our plate the harvest to be won by labor's love. And into the cup we pour all the sap which is to be pressed out this day from the Earth's fruits.

ALL: O Gracious One, giver of the gifts we bring, receive them from your church gathered here today, affirming the sacrament of your Presence among us.

Prayer Over the Gifts

O Holy One, in these gifts you give us food for body and spirit. May our strength be renewed by your generous blessings that will bring us health of mind and body. Amen.

The Holy One is with us, abounding in Love!

- **1.** Giving thanks to the Source of All Life, we open our hearts in the name of Jesus, who lives and loves, heals and empowers, through us.
- **2.** We praise you, O God of wonder and life, as we celebrate Jesus' life and ministry and as witness to the life of compassion and love we are all called to live. We now lift up our hearts with the choirs of angels:

3. Creator God, we see around us the work of your hands, the fruit of your wisdom and love. The unfolding story of creation witnesses unceasingly

to your creative power. We, your creatures, often deviate from that wisdom, hindering your creative presence in our midst.

- **4.** Sending among us Jesus, our Light and Hope, you birth afresh in our world the power of Sophia Wisdom, and in the gift of the Spirit, your creative goodness blooms anew, amid the variety and wonder of life.
- **ALL:** Spirit of Life, all that exists is blessed and enlivened by your presence. May these gifts of bread and fruit of the vine, and our very lives, be the nourishment we need to sustain us.
 - **5.** As a Christian people we celebrate the Open Table, proclaimed by Jesus our liberator and our friend, a Table of abundant life, inclusive love, and liberation, where all are welcome, and from which no one is to be excluded.

At this gathering, we take bread, as Jesus took bread, and we remember, as Jesus remembered, the constant presence of the Spirit of Life and Love. And Jesus offers it to us now, saying: (All raise bread)

ALL: Take and eat, all of you.

This is my very Self which I give to strengthen you.

Jesus then raised a cup of blessing, spoke the grace, and offers it to us now, saying: (All raise cup)

ALL: Take and drink this Cup of Life, the Covenant made new again through my life in you. Whenever you remember me like this, I am among you.

We give thanks for who we are in Christ:

ALL: Matter becomes conscious, the universe coming to reflect on itself: earthen vessels that hold a treasure, temple of God's Spirit, the Body of Christ.

(All raise bread and cup)

ALL: For it is through learning to live as Jesus lived,
And why he lived,
And for whom he lived,
That we awaken to your Spirit within,
Moving us to worship you truly,
Life-giving God,
At this time, and all time, and in all ways.

Cantor: Amen!

Communion Rite

We pray as these gifts are shared among us:

- **6.** Loving God, you call us to live the Gospel of peace and justice. *We will live justly.*
- **7.** Loving God, you call us to be your presence in the world. *We will love tenderly.*
- **1.** Loving God, you call us to speak truth to power. We will walk with integrity in your abiding presence.

(Presider raises bread and cup)

This is the Bread and Cup of Life, through which we are nourished, and we nourish one another.

ALL: We receive this bread and fruit of the vine as the presence of Christ among us!

- **ALL:** For you are the ground of the fruitful vision, the birthing power, and the fulfillment, as all is gathered and made whole once again. Amen.

O God of Compassion and Grace, we thank you for the blessing of connection which goes deeper than human knowing. We come into the world in mystery and we go away the same. We honor the gifts of life. May all here carry forward the goodness, the love, and courage of the blessed ones who've gone before us. May we go forth from this place empowered by your strengthening presence. Amen.
